We have also had some bad news. You may have seen in the Epsom Guardian that over the weekend of September 13th and 14th the Ecovols container at the kiln site was broken into and our beloved JCB Groundhog vehicle stolen along with the Stihl brush cutter and, somewhat bizarrely, John Turner's chainsaw trousers, a chainsaw helmet, a bag containing the brush cutter harness, 12 litres of water and a few disposable dust overalls. The thieves were able to cut open a substantial welded steel padlock cover and chop off a 6mm steel hasp. In addition two chains and 6 padlocks were cut to gain access to the container. A set of bolt cutters was later found abandoned by a dog walker near the site. The loss of the Groundhog is a major blow to our conservation work, and although insured will take some time to replace. We then have the problem of where to keep it in future as clearly the container is no longer safe. We did not insure our tools this year as the premium quoted was £530 per annum with an excess of £1000 which was not considered reasonable and in this case would not have covered the loss. We did have a successful working party on Barons Pond on September 21st and 22nd using a small selection of hand tools, but some of our planned sites are difficult to access without an off road vehicle. Our road reps leader Vicki Rees will be stepping down in the New Year because of family commitments. I would like to thank Vicki for all her hard work after taking over the role from Ron New and for making a number of improvements to our computer system for membership records. I am now looking for someone to take over this role which is vital to the ongoing success of the Association. The main tasks are liaising with the road reps, distributing the newsletters to the road reps, managing the membership database and collecting the subscriptions from the road reps. Please let me know if you could consider taking over this role. Vicki and I would be pleased to answer questions and provide more details.

Although the restoration of the circular path has not yet started mainly due to consent issues where the path crosses the fuel pipeline which will require additional work not planned for, we remain confident that the work will start this year.

Cattle Checking report

The cattle grazing on the Common is now a regular feature from late spring to early autumn and helps to maintain the diversity of habitat which is so important for the Common's SSSI status. This year's herd of 35 steers arrived at the beginning of May. From the start one animal repeatedly escaped from Horton Heath by jumping over the fence but after this initial excitement they all settled well. They all thrived, and were effective in keeping the grassy areas under control. However, by mid-August the exceptionally dry spell had slowed the re-growth of the grass, so the farmer decided to remove them.

The health and security of the animals is checked daily, and volunteers from the Association carry out the task on several days each week. This year we gained several new volunteers, but others have stepped down. This means that we are always trying to recruit volunteers both as replacements and to increase the number in order to share the load. Those already involved find the task pleasantly rewarding.
